OUTLINE

This course places students for one week in Germany's Heilbronn-Franken region, which boasts a large concentration of highly successful small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs). Global leaders in numerous niche markets, these so-called *Mittelstand* companies are the backbone of Germany's export-oriented economy. Right at the source, in our picturesque wine-growing region, you will learn how Germany's *Mittelstand* companies operate and how they are managed for success. The course is structured in two parts: (1) *Mittelstand* companies and their economic and societal context and (2) the internal workings of *Mittelstand* companies. The course is taught by GGS faculty and guest lecturers from companies and civic institutions. Company visits and a cultural program will round out the program.

The city of Heilbronn (population 125,437) is the hub of the Heilbronn-Franken region in the state of Baden-Württemberg in southwestern Germany. The region provides more than 329,000 jobs of which 45% are in manufacturing and 54% are in the service sector. Principal industries are metalworking (cars and car parts, machine and tool construction), electronics, food and luxury foods, paper and printing, chemicals, and salt mining. The region is home to the headquarters of several wholesale and discount retail companies. Heilbronn is Germany's leading red wine region with more than 500 ha (1,236 acres) of vineyards.

How to get to Heilbronn I

Airports

The closest airports to Heilbronn are Stuttgart (STR, 1.5 hours from Heilbronn) and Frankfurt (FRA, 2 hours from Heilbronn). If you have to connect in Frankfurt to fly to Stuttgart, make Frankfurt your final destination instead. To get to Heilbronn you can either take the train or rent a car.

Getting to Heilbronn by Train

From Stuttgart Airport: At the airport, follow the signs to the regional trains: S. Take line S2 or S3 towards Stuttgart Hauptbahnhof-Hbf (Stuttgart main train station). After arriving at the underground level of the station, follow the signs to the main level of the station: DB (for Deutsche Bahn = German Railways). The train station is a major construction site. Find the platforms for the regional trains (typically a track number between 5 and 9) and take a regional train (RE or RB) to Heilbronn Hauptbahnhof-Hbf (Heilbronn main station). You can buy a ticket for the whole trip to Heilbronn at the airport train station. The trip takes about 1.5 hours (including transfer time). Trains run about every half hour.

From Frankfurt Airport: The train station is located underneath the Frankfurt airport. The trip to Heilbronn takes about 2 hours and requires a transfer at *Mannheim Hauptbahnhof-Hbf* (main train station). Trains run about every 20 minutes.

Getting to the Hotel from the Train Station


The hotel is opposite the train station and only about 100 meters away. It's walking distance. When you get out of the train station, you will see a golden sculpture on the other side of the street to the left. Cross the street and behind this sculpture you will see the B&B Hotel located at the corner of Mozartstrasse/Rosskampfstrasse.

Arrival by Car

From Highway A6: Take exit *Heilbronn-Zentrum/Neckarsulm/Mosbach* and drive toward *Heilbronn/Neckarsulm*. Follow road B27 toward downtown Heilbronn. Follow the green hotel signs or the parking guidance system (toward *Käthchenhof*). See above for hotel name and address.

From Highway A81: Take exit *Heilbronn-Zentrum/Untergruppenbach/Löwenstein* and follow road L1111 to Heilbronn. Once in Heilbronn, follow the green hotel signs or the parking guidance system (toward *Käthchenhof*). See above for hotel name and address.

Parking

There is space for more than 480 cars on campus. You can either use the parking structure at Dammstrasse or the surface lot across the parking structure. Mon - Fri / 8:00 AM - 4:00 PM Sat - Sun / 8:00 AM - 10:00 AM


Smoke Free Environment

Please note that there is no smoking (including e-cigarettes) inside any of the buildings on campus. Smoking is permitted outside the buildings.


Lockers are located in the basement of the GGS building and in the Forum.

There is **free WiFi access** on campus with your access codes.




Bildungscampus Dieter Schwarz Stiftung II - Forum

General Information II

Smoking

Smoking is still prevalent in Germany and sensitivity towards non-smokers is not as pronounced as in the US, Canada, or some other European countries. Smoking is not allowed in offices, public buildings, and inside restaurants. However, restaurants often have a separate room for smokers. Sometimes patrons have to pass through the smoking area before reaching the non-smoking area. Also, smoking is generally allowed in outside seating areas of German restaurants.

Drinking Water and Beverages

Tap water is generally safe to drink in Germany. However, most restaurants do not provide a free glass of water as is customary in the US and Canada. You can, however, order mineral water which comes fully carbonated ("mit Kohlensäure"), with some fizz ("Medium"), and without fizz ("Still"). Soft drinks typically come without ice. Don't be surprised if they are even room temperature. You can typically ask for ice, though.

You have to be 16 years of age to drink wine and beer. You have to be 18 to drink distilled liquor. However, if minors age 14 and 15 are with a parent or legal guardian, they are allowed to drink wine and beer as well.

Tipping in Restaurants

In Germany, waiters are paid by the restaurant and tips don't have to be as high as in the US or Canada. If you liked the service, you may want to round up (3-6%).

Money

Germany uses the Euro (€). Have cash on hand for smaller purchases. Some stores don't accept credit or debit cards for smaller purchases. ATMs are available on campus and throughout the city. Please check with your card issuer if your card works on German ATMs.
