Visa and Health Insurance		
Visa and Residence Permit	Non-EU citizens require a student visa and an early application is essential (immediately after receiving the letter of acceptance).	
	Students from Japan, New Zealand, Malaysia and Singapore must apply for a "Einreisebewilligung" (entry permit) through the SML International Office.	
	All exchange students must apply for a residence permit ("L-Permit") upon arrival.	
	Proof of financial solvency (CHF 1'750 per month) is required for both visa and residence permit applications.	
Health Insurance	A basic health insurance is mandatory by law in Switzerland.	
	Non-EU residents must buy a Swiss health insurance (currently approx. CHF 90,- per month); any international health insurance obtained in the home country is not sufficient.	
	EU residents with EHIC cards can waive this obligation by presenting a copy (the card needs to be valid for the entire duration of the stay in Switzerland).
