PRACTICAL INFORMATION

COURSES

- Undergraduate exchange students must take 12-20 course credits per quarter
- Students will be required to take at least 50% of their courses each term from within their assigned Drexel major
- Each student will be assigned to a Drexel academic advisor who will register them for classes
- Class selection is subject to course availability and fulfillment of pre-requisites



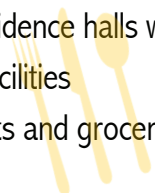
HOUSING

- On-campus housing is guaranteed for full-year (fall/winter/spring) students, but cannot be guaranteed for 1-2 term students
- Suite style and double-occupancy rooms are available
- Off-campus housing is also available. Students must arrange off-campus accommodations independently



MEALS

- Exchange students may participate in university dining plans, but they are not required to do so
- Students living in on-campus residence halls will have shared access to kitchen facilities
- There are a variety of restaurants and grocery stores near the university



VISA

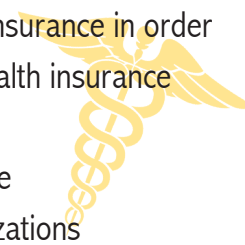
- All incoming exchange students are required to obtain a J1 Student Visa
- Drexel will issue a DS-2019 visa document to students upon acceptance



HEALTH INSURANCE & IMMUNIZATIONS

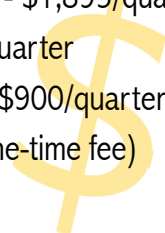
All exchange students must...

- Purchase Drexel's health insurance in order to meet US immigration health insurance requirement
- Pay a \$35 immunization fee
- Complete required immunizations

STUDENT NOMINATIONS

Please nominate exchange students who meet Drexel eligibility requirements through completing all required fields in the Google form found here: <http://goo.gl/forms/HtBfGQBRQm>.

Exchange students are accepted into a specific major program and are required to take at least 50% (e.g. 3 out of 5 courses) of their courses each term from within their assigned Drexel major. If a student's home institution major is not offered at Drexel, please indicate which Drexel major would be the most appropriate for the student. Please note that exchange students may only enroll in courses for which they have completed the equivalent prerequisites.

- Passport copy
- Official TOEFL/IELTS scores (if applicable)
- Preliminary course selections
- Inbound Exchange Application Form
- Portfolio (if applicable)
