PRACTICAL INFORMATION

COURSES

- Undergraduate exchange students must take 12-20 course credits per quarter
- Students will be required to take at least 50% of their courses each term from within their assigned Drexel major
- Each student will be assigned to a Drexel academic advisor who will register them for classes
- Class selection is subject to course availability and fulfilment of pre-requisites

MEALS

- Exchange students may participate in university dining plans, but they are not required to do so
- Students living in on-campus residence halls will have shared access to kitchen facilities
- There are a variety of restaurants and grocery stores near the university

VISA

- All incoming exchange students are required to
 obtain a J1 Student Visa
- Drexel will issue a DS-2019 visa document to students upon acceptance

HOUSING

- On-campus housing is guaranteed for full-year (fall/winter/spring) students, but cannot be guaranteed for 1-2 term students
- Suite style and double-occupancy rooms are available
- Off-campus housing is also available. Students must arrange off-campus accomodations independently

HEALTH INSURANCE & Immunizations

All exchange students must ...

- Purchase Drexel's health insurance in order to meet US immigration health insurance requirement
- Pay a \$35 immunization fee
- Complete required immunizations

NOMINATION Details

All exchange students must be nominated by their home institution to participate in the exchange program. If you have not yet been nominated, please contact your home school advisor.

Upon nomination, you will be prompted to complete the Drexel exchange student application. Upon your acceptance, you will be assigned a major at Drexel that most closely matches your home school major (see page 2 for a list of all majors). Each term at Drexel, you will be required to take 50% of your courses from within that major.
