Please note:

- French language and culture classes are organized for both semesters
- For the programmes taught in English, we strongly recommend that non-native English speakers or students not taking their home university degree in English provide a TOEFL score of 550 or equivalent or have an English professor complete the <u>English language certificate</u>, attesting to a minimum of B2 according to the EU
- Exchange students are expected to take 30 ECTS credit per semester
