## German Language Requirements /Language Courses

German Language Requirements	<p>Exchange students are <b>exempt</b> from a German language exam (DSH or TestDaF), which is otherwise required for international degree-seeking students studying at a German university.</p> <p>The School of Business Administration and Economics requires excellent German language skills (at least level B2) <b>for classes taught in German.</b></p> <p>During the winter term the <b>M.Sc. in M&amp;M and FACTS</b> offers <b>courses in English</b> (approx. worth 30 ECTS in each program).</p>
German Language Courses	<p>German language courses which are offered <u>during</u> the semester are free of charge. Again, basic German language proficiency (level A2) is required. If students wish to participate in a German language course, they have to take a placement test which will be offered during the orientation week. <b>Without this test, exchange students are not eligible to take language classes.</b></p> <p>Further information is available at <a href="http://www.sprachenzentrum.fu-berlin.de/en/sprachangebot/sprachen/deutsch/index.html">http://www.sprachenzentrum.fu-berlin.de/en/sprachangebot/sprachen/deutsch/index.html</a></p> <p><b>Preparatory German language courses:</b> A six-week intensive preparatory German language course (20 x 45 min of instruction per week) will be offered prior to the beginning of the winter term. ## Visa Requirements

	<p>Students who are citizens of EU or EEA countries, Australia, Brazil, Canada, Israel, Japan, New Zealand, South Korea, Switzerland or the USA do <b>not need a visa</b> in order to enter Germany.          Students who are NOT citizens of the countries listed above must apply for a student visa (<i>Visum zu Studienzwecken</i>) at the local German Embassy or a German General Consulate <b>before</b> they come to Germany.  <b>We therefore urge those students to apply for a study visa as soon as possible. It will take at least six weeks, sometimes a few months, to process the visa application.</b> The necessary documents concerning the admission to our university will be sent to the student as soon as possible. ## Health Insurance

	<p>Exchange students must have comprehensive health insurance valid in Germany for enrollment as a full-time student at Freie Universität Berlin <b>and</b> for obtaining a residence permit.          Students who EITHER have the European Health Insurance Card (EU and EEA students only) OR who can provide proof of an adequate comprehensive health insurance valid in Germany (unlimited in case of illness and rescue) may request an insurance waiver. A waiver can be obtained at a German state-regulated health insurance company, not at the university.</p>

	<p>Since many insurance policies purchased outside Germany require substantial co-payments, have caps or exclude many illnesses it has been increasingly difficult for exchange student to obtain a waiver. We therefore urge all students younger than 30 years to purchase a German student health insurance for about 91 Euros per months. The German student health insurance policies are very comprehensive and automatically accepted by the office granting residence permits. All housing options are available from the beginning of September/October or March/April onwards and cost about 270 – 550 € per month. Registration deadline	<p><b>Since there has been a dramatic increase of student housing demand, students wishing to use the accommodation service must apply online as soon as possible and no later than December 15 or June 15 using the link above.</b> Registrations will be on a first come, first served basis.</p>

## Arrival in Berlin

Enrollment	<p>Upon arrival in Berlin, we advise students to visit the Student Mobility Office immediately during office hours in order to finalize student enrollment and set up their FU account. Students need this account in order to enroll for courses and use computers on campus. Students participating in the Departmental Exchange Programs will be enrolled in the corresponding subject (M.Sc. in Management &amp;</p>

Social fees/Public transportation	Marketing or M.Sc. in Finance, Accounting, Taxation). They will be admitted and enrolled as full-time students only for the duration they have been nominated for by the Departmental Coordinator at Freie Universität Berlin.  Exchange students are exempt from university fees, but they still need to pay the so-called social fees of approx. 265 € per semester. These are non-university related fees and pay for the student union as well as for a public transportation ticket for the whole area of Berlin for the entire semester. Students will be asked to pay the fees after arrival in Berlin as part of the enrollment process.
Residence Permit	Once students are enrolled at Freie Universität Berlin, they must apply for a residence permit ( <i>Aufenthaltserlaubnis</i> ) within three months (except students from EU or EEA countries). Students will be provided with detailed information and assistance upon enrollment.

## Orientation

	Orientation takes place two weeks prior to the lecture period (beginning of October). It is strongly recommended to participate in our orientation week. Students will be provided with essential information about studying at Freie Universität Berlin such as course selection and enrolment, campus tours and how to use libraries and computers. 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## Mandatory fees

	Exchange students are exempt from tuition, but are required to pay the so-called social fees of approx. 300 EUR per semester. These are non-university related fees and pay for the student union as well as for a public transportation ticket for the whole area of Berlin for the entire semester. Students will be asked to pay the fees after arrival in Berlin as part of the enrolment process.

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## De-Enrollment
