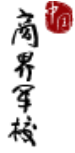

2.2 Course specific objectives

Character class :

1. In the Chinese character class , students will learn how to read and write 130~150 Chinese characters that have appeared in the textbook *Standard Course HSK 1 and 2* as well as the same number of words which consist of these characters. They will have a thorough understanding of these characters by learning where these characters come from , how they were made , and how they are used in real life.

2. In addition to language skills, our students will also have access to the Chinese culture including Chinese food, art, history, geography and popular culture etc. To make the best use of online courses, we are going to use multimedia to create an immersive learning environment. All the cultural background knowledge will be connected closely to the language study as well. After learning this course, students will master a couple of traditional talents like reading poetry, singing Chinese songs or writing calligraphy etc.
