### Special Note

At MUIC, exchange and visiting students cannot enroll in research project classes (science) and internships. Additionally, not all courses listed in the course catalog are offered every term, and exchange students may need approval from program directors to register for classes that require prerequisite courses.

\*Seats in class are limited and are rarely available for inbound students.

### Academic overview

MUIC academic calendar operates on a trimester system. Each trimester has 12 weeks of lecture classes and one week of final exams. Lecture classes are scheduled every day between 8:00 - 18:00 hrs. Classes usually take place for two hours/day twice per week. Each course is worth 4 MUIC credits with equaling 48 hours of lectures.

### Course load

Inbound students can sign up for a minimum of 12 credits (mostly equivalent to three subjects). The standard course load per trimester is 16 credit hours.

### Visa Information

All students are required to obtain a student visa before entering Thailand. A supporting letter from MUIC will be forwarded to the university coordinator for the students to use when applying for an education visa at the Royal Thai Embassy in the student's country.

**\*NOTE** MUIC does not assist students in applying for a work permit or part-time job

### Health Insurance

Students must purchase an international health insurance plan from their home countries and bring documents that show proof of their health insurance. While studying in Thailand, exchange students are encouraged to apply for health insurance covering the hospital outpatient department (OPD) visits at Thai private hospitals. Since the public hospital system in Thailand, students may need to pay in advance the health treatment fee for further reimbursement with their insurance company.

### Uniform

Students must wear a uniform while attending classes at MUIC. Uniforms can be purchased at the college, or students may bring white button-front shirts and black skirts for females or white button-front shirts and black trousers for males. Students must also wear plain black shoes or plain sport shoes.
