Wits Business School (WBS) is the graduate school of business administration of the University of the Witwatersrand (Wits University), a highly ranked African research institution. The University, which celebrated its centenary in 2022, is renowned for the influential role it has played in South Africa's socio-political history and boasts four Nobel prize winners among its alumni body, including former president Nelson Mandela. The enduring 'Wits' brand, recognised internationally, continues to symbolise academic rigour, research excellence and thought leadership on the African continent.



WBS was founded in 1968, making it one of the oldest and most respected business schools in Africa. The School continues to grow, evolve and innovate — repeatedly spearheading new areas of study to take the next generation of African business leaders into the future. Apart from its MBA, WBS offers a wide range of specialist Master of Management programmes and cutting-edge leadership executive development, and leads the field locally in new areas of research, including digital business, energy leadership, health leadership and African philanthropy.

WBS is the only business school in Africa to be a member of the Partnership in International Management (PIM), an association which promotes global student and faculty exchange programmes. Each year a number of students from business schools around the world attend our MBA programme for their electives.
